Monitor for any dizziness (fall risk) 3. Assess any agitation or irritability 4. Assess and monitor closely for increased SI
Quetiapine fumarate	Atypical antipsychotics	Insomnia	100 mg PO at bedtime	Y N	N/A	Dizziness, hypotension, tremor, anemia, tachycardia, seizures, EPS	1. Monitor for any seizure activity 2. Assess motor function (EPS) 3. Monitor vital signs (BP & HR) 4. Be aware of hypotension, fall risk when standing up too quickly
