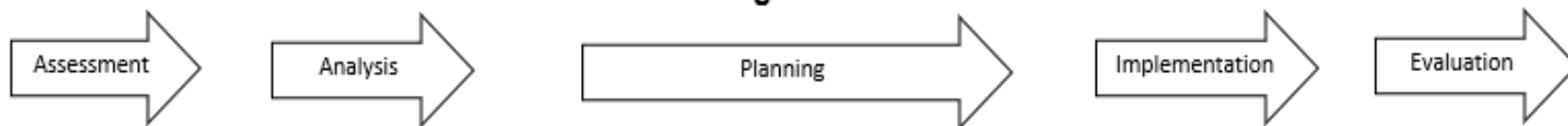

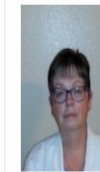

Collaborative Learning Guidelines

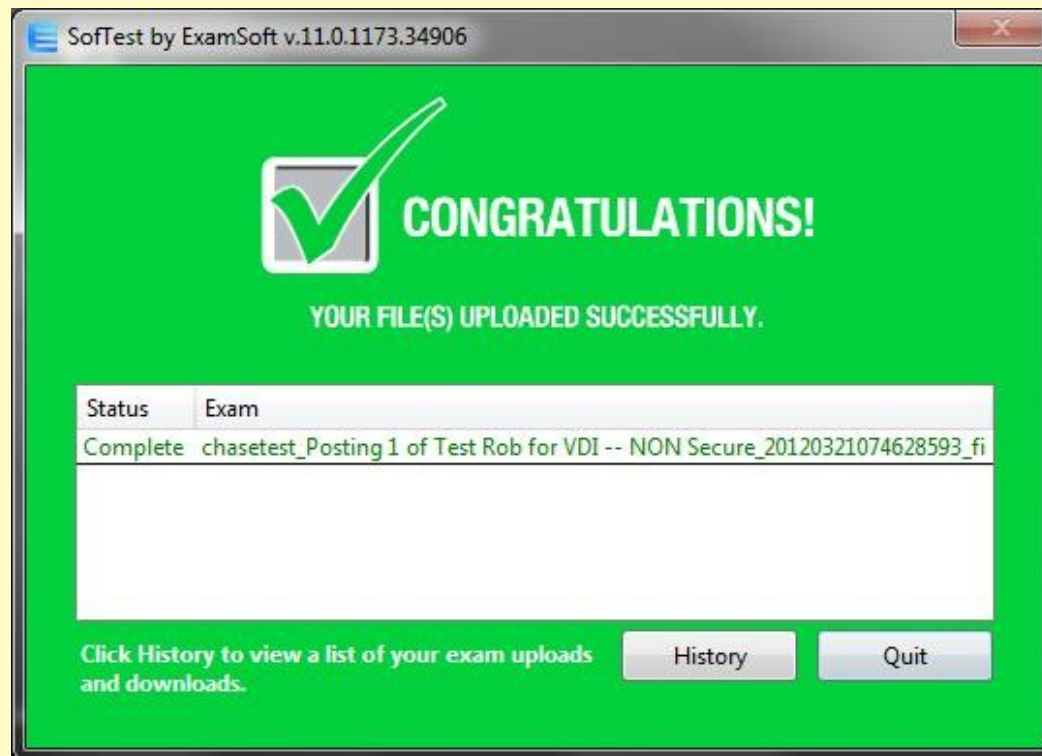
WHAT HAPPENS IF I'M LATE OR MISS AN EXAM?

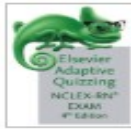
WHAT HAPPENS IF I FORGET TO UPLOAD MY EXAM?

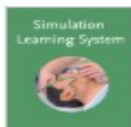

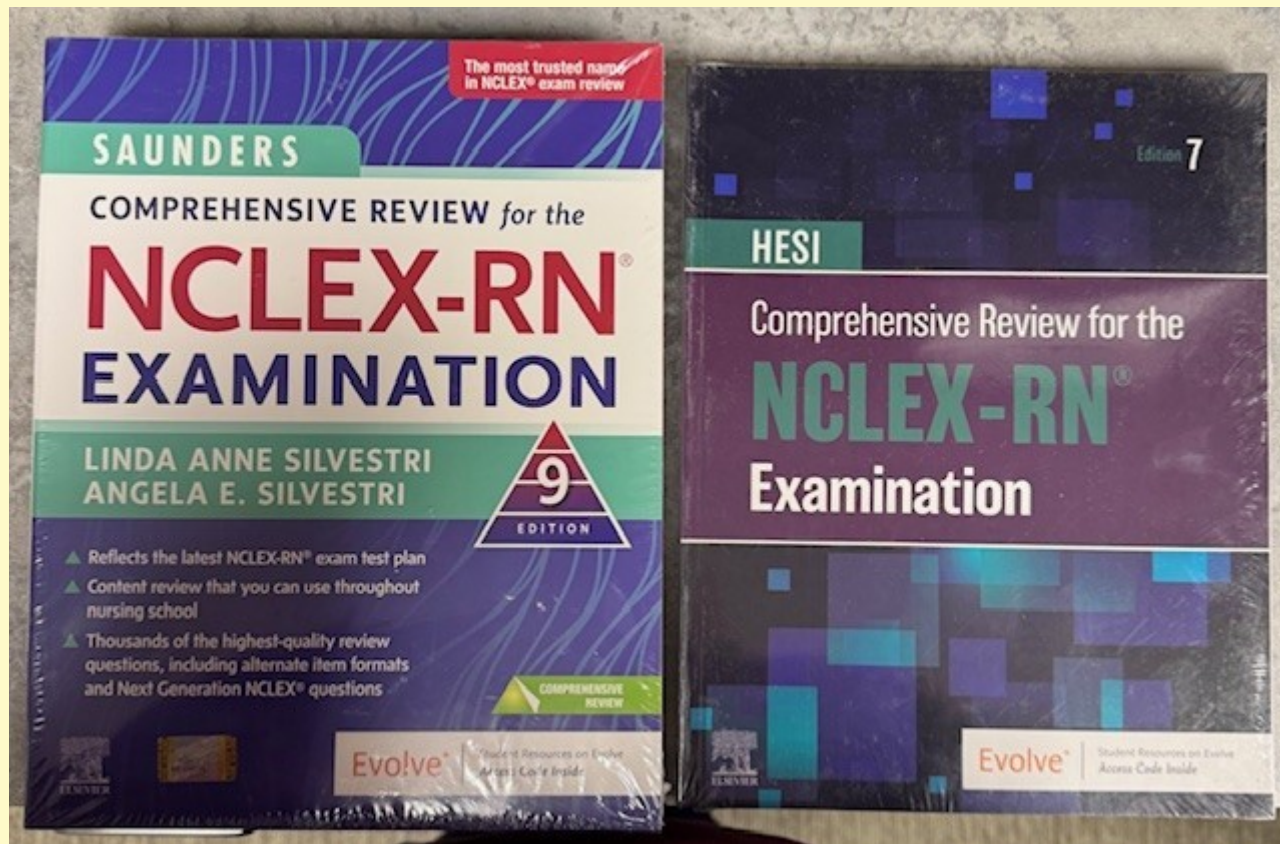

LAB/CLINICAL ATTIRE

- CSON Scrubs – Ceil blue top and navy-blue bottoms to be worn for sim experiences and clinical
- Undershirt can be black, white, navy, or gray but cannot be seen below the hem of the scrub top.
- Ceil blue jackets only, no other colors
- Neat, clean, wrinkle-free, and odor-free
- Close-toed shoes & socks
- Crocks (without the holes) can be worn if they are white or match the color of scrubs
- One small unobtrusive stud facial piercing
- NO dangling bracelets
- No ear bars or ear gauges, these are required to be filled

LAB/CLINICAL ATTIRE

- No strong scented lotions or perfumes
- Hair pulled **back**
- Men's beards and mustaches must be clean and trimmed (see student HB)
- NO artificial nails of any kind! Regular nail polish, nail dip, & shellac nails are acceptable. Nails must be short and clean!
- NO exposure of offensive tattoos and facial tattoos must be covered.
- Bring all needed supplies (paper, pen, required material) – Must have ID badge
- Your appearance is part of the dress code!!
