Will increase bleeding, use soft bristled toothbrush, electric razor, and avoid any activities that may cause trauma 2. Increase physical activity (Passive ROM) to prevent formation of DVT 3. Report/ assess bleeding in the gums, nosebleeds, blood in urine, or black/tarry stool, bruising

Report seizure activity to the HCP to adjust dose if necessary and report any significant changes 4. Monitor for side effects such as sedation, behavioral, and emotional

N/A	Pneumonitis, Pulmonary Fibrosis, Hepatotoxicity, C. diff, CDAD	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Medicine may cause urine to turn into a rust-yellow to brown color 2. Medication may cause dizziness, vertigo, and confusion. Call for assistance. 3. Assess for s/s of UTI (Frequency, pain, cloudy, foul-smelling urine, fever) 4. Instruct mother to notify HCP if fever or diarrhea develops, especially if the stool contains blood, pus, or mucus as this may be a sign of CDAD
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
