

Instructional Module 6: Obstetrics Community Clinical Experience

1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe? The procedure that I was looking forward to observing was a patient getting the Nexplanon implant out. The patient changed her mind and wanted to go ahead and keep it until the original removal date. Other than that I observed breast exams and pap smears.

2. What was the best/most interesting part of the experience?

The most interesting part was hearing how insurance companies would not cover a topical medication that was \$90. I was with Bridget for the day, but Angela would come in and tell us about her patients insurance not covering a medication that was \$2,100, that was Medicare.

3. Is a community nursing position something that you would consider working in? Why or why not?

I would later in my life but right now I wouldn't because it's slow and it seems like the only interesting part would be the patients background story.

4. Do you feel like this community site met the needs of the population they serve? Why or why not?

Yes, they came with their concerns and left with answers or either a plan of care. Nobody left the office wondering what the next step was.

5. Did you witness patient teaching? What general things were taught to this population? Do you feel that patient teaching in this community site was adequate? Why or why not?

Yes, I saw a lot of patient teaching. Most of it was about birth control, but general health concerns for all types of ages. Evaluating medications that the patients were on, and making adjustments as needed.

Safety & Quality:

Clinical Judgment: we had a patient concerned about her having recurrent BV and light vaginal bleeding. She was unaware of what signs to look for since it is always asymptomatic. She stated she has done everything to not get it such as loose clothing, cotton underwear, but it keeps coming back. WINSO stated they were always unsure whether to treat due to

Patient Centered Care: it being asymptomatic, and if they do treat with antibiotics it would kill off the good bacteria as well as the bad. She recommended her to take a probiotic and gave education on that the bacteria sticks to the walls and sometimes gets hard to treat. She also put her on Diflucan.

Professionalism: Nurse practitioner displayed professionalism by listening to her patients at eye level. She presented herself a patient to them all. She let them finish what they were saying before she added her comments. The nurse practitioner gave

Communication & Collaboration: clear instructions on what they needed to do in the next steps of their plan of care. Before she went in the room, we looked up information in the patients chart to get a clear understanding of their history, that way when we walked into the patients chart we could help the patient fill in gray areas they couldn't recall so much, and to just know about the patient in general.
