Pain assessment (location, duration, type) 2. Check back for improvement of fever or relief of pain 3. Contact HCP for s/s of dark urine, tiredness, decreased appetite, upset stomach or stomach pain, light-colored stools, throwing up, or yellow skin or eyes—hepatotoxicity

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							4. Maximum dose is 5 times in 24 hours
Ibuprofen	Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory (NSAID)	Analgesic, antipyretic	112 mg, PO, q 6 hrs PRN (pain, fever)	Yes	N/A	Acute overdose may result in metabolic acidosis. / Black Box Alert: increased risk of new onset or worsening of preexisting hypertension	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pain assessment (location, duration, type) 2. Do not take with aspirin, both are NSAIDs and taking them together increase risk of side effects or overdose 3. To avoid GI upset take with food or milk 4. Check back for improvement of fever or relief of pain
Ondansetron	Selective receptor antagonist	Antinausea, antiemetic	2 mg, PO, q 8 hrs PRN (N/V)	Yes	N/A	Hypertension, Respiratory depression	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Assess for dehydration if excessive vomiting occurs 2. Assess bowel sounds for peristalsis. Monitor daily pattern of bowel activity and stool consistency 3. Relief from nausea/vomiting generally occurs shortly after drug administration 4. May cause dizziness, irritability, or

Zinc oxide-cod liver oil-lanolin	Mineral ointment	Basic ointment and protectants	40%, topical, PRN (diaper rash)	Yes	N/A	Allergic reaction	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Check the label to see if you should shake the bottle well before using 2. Clean the diaper area well before use and allow the area to dry before applying the product 3. Burning, stinging, redness, or irritation may occur, if symptoms worsen contact HCP 4. Consult HCP or pharmacist before using this product if skin cut/sores, or signs of infection are present
