## Instructional Module 6: Obstetrics Community Clinical Experience

Community Site: Dr. Lamothe's office

1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

I observed three annual breast and vaginal exams and took vitals for almost all patients that came in. I also got to measure fundal height and estimate gestational age.

2. What was the best/most interesting part of the experience?

One of our patients came in to discuss removal of her IUD and found that it was no longer in place. She was scheduled for an ultrasound to determine whether it had fallen out or migrated into her abdomen.

3. Is a community nursing position something that you would consider working in? Why or why not?

I really enjoyed working so closely with women of all ages and it was interesting to see the variety of patients. We saw expectant mothers, menopausal women, and women seeking birth control. I would consider working in the clinic setting due to it being fast paced and yet controlled.

4. Do you feel like this community site met the needs of the population they serve? Why or why not?

The community site definitely met the needs of the population. Dr. Lamothe was very professional, approachable, and caring to his patients and made sure to include them in their plan of care. He provided multiple dates for one patient to schedule her induction and spent considerable time providing education to another patient seeking birth control options.

5. Did you witness patient teaching? What general things were taught to this population? Do you feel that patient teaching in this community site was adequate? Why or why not?

Dr. Lamothe did an amazing job of teaching to multiple populations. He educated the menopausal patient about menopause and hair loss as well as her concerns on some skin changes. He provided many options to our patient in terms of contraception, and was very patient in ensuring that a patient that had recently immigrated from Russia was involved in her care and understood the teaching. Patients were all taught about signs of labor and when to seek care.
