Generic Name	Dosage with route and schedule	IVP-List diluent solution, volume, and rate of administration IVPB- List concentration and rate of administration	Patient specific therapeutic reasoning	Patient specific teaching with reasoning
Vancomycin	125mg capsule PO QID	N/A	Bacterial Infection	1. Hepatotoxic, report any blood in the urine; monitor urine output closely 2. Report any changes to hearing; may cause hearing loss and tinnitus 3. Report any rash and itching that occur; rare, but serious dermatological like TEN or SJS 4. Expect some abdominal pain on this medication as it can irritate the GI Tract (as well as nausea and vomiting); report these incidents
Metoprolol	100mg tablet PO Daily	N/A	Hypertension CHF Angina	1. Do not stop taking this medication abruptly => rebound hypertension 2. Report any alterations to breathing (bronchospasm) 3. Use call light for assistance with moving, patient may feel dizzy, fatigue, and confusion with lower BP 4. Take the medication with a meal to aid in the absorption
Prednisone	10mg tablet PO BID	N/A	Allergy Disorders Asthma COPD	1. Avoid taking the medication late at night as it mimics cortisol and can interfere with sleep 2. Long term use, supplement Vitamin D and Calcium into diet to

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				prevent osteoporosis 3. Do not take this medication if you are currently on oral anti-fungal medication 4. Do not get a “Live Vaccine”, this increases your risk for harmful effects due to weakened immune system
Ondansetron	4mg tablet Q 6hr PO (SL) (prn N/V)	N/A	Nausea Vomiting	1. Do not chew or swallow tablet; let it dissolve 2. Report any neurological disturbances or depressions (Assess patient neuro status every time you walk in the room) 3. Report if your heart begins to beat “funny” or feels like “skipping a beat”: can cause arrhythmias 4. Can cause severe headache and dizziness, use the call light when getting out of bed to avoid a fall incident
Levofloxacin	750mg PO Daily	N/A	Bacterial Infection	1. Avoid sun exposure as the medication causes photosensitivity 2. Report any pain, swelling, tenderness around joint and muscles (especially in lower extremities) known to cause tendon rupture 3. Monitor urine output and color due to risk of hepatotoxicity 4. Report development of N/V/D as the medication causes GI irritation
