

Instructional Module 6: Obstetrics Community Clinical Experience

Community Site: City of Lubbock Health – Department STD Clinic

1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

The morning part was slow. They only had three patients, who went with a different nurse, who I was not following. I got to see that nurse did a ventrogluteal shot but not the right way. I got to do all the blood draws and an HIV testing procedure.
