<p style="text-align: center;">Safety & Quality</p> <p>Describe anything you accomplished to maintain a safe, quality environment</p>	<p>While at Oceans, maintaining a safe, quality environment is essential for their care. We ensured that doors will close behind us to decrease elopement cases, allowed patients to express in a safe non judgmental environment.</p>

How can you use this to further improve your practice in the future? • What have you learned from clinical? 	<p>While at group therapy, the topics discussed in the two days I attended were anger management, being ware of triggers, and rumination. This set the environment to be a comfortable environment for clients to engage and discuss their backgrounds. The therapist used exploring and various clarifying techniques. These are effective therapeutic communication techniques to build trust and understanding between clients. In this clinical I learned the importance of these techniques and saw how significant they were to them. I am encouraged to keep practicing this to promote quality of care.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Patient Centered Care</p> <p>Identify one client in the group, what concerns, recommendations/interventions would you suggest?</p>	<p>I spoke with a patient admitted due to SI with schizophrenia. I was mostly concerned about his medical adherence since he just started a new medication. I recommended the client to adhere to the medication since it can take some weeks for therapeutic effect, and to use his community resources when discharged. I informed him to strong consider an Intensive Outpatient program or a partial hospitalization program for support.</p>

About yourself?)</p>	<p>I showed professionalism by introducing myself to my assigned patients and the other clients as a nursing student. I was cordial to all clients and did my best to make them feel comfortable.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Communication & Collaboration</p> <p>Describe how you utilized therapeutic communication/collaboration</p>	<p>While talking to the clients, many shared vulnerable and personal experiences with me. I maintained eye contact, practiced use of silence and active listening to allow them to express. I also used various of the clarifications techniques such as paraphrasing to let them know I was paying attention and reflecting of feelings.</p>

I was mostly concerned on how the patients would react/respond to nursing students being present.</p>
