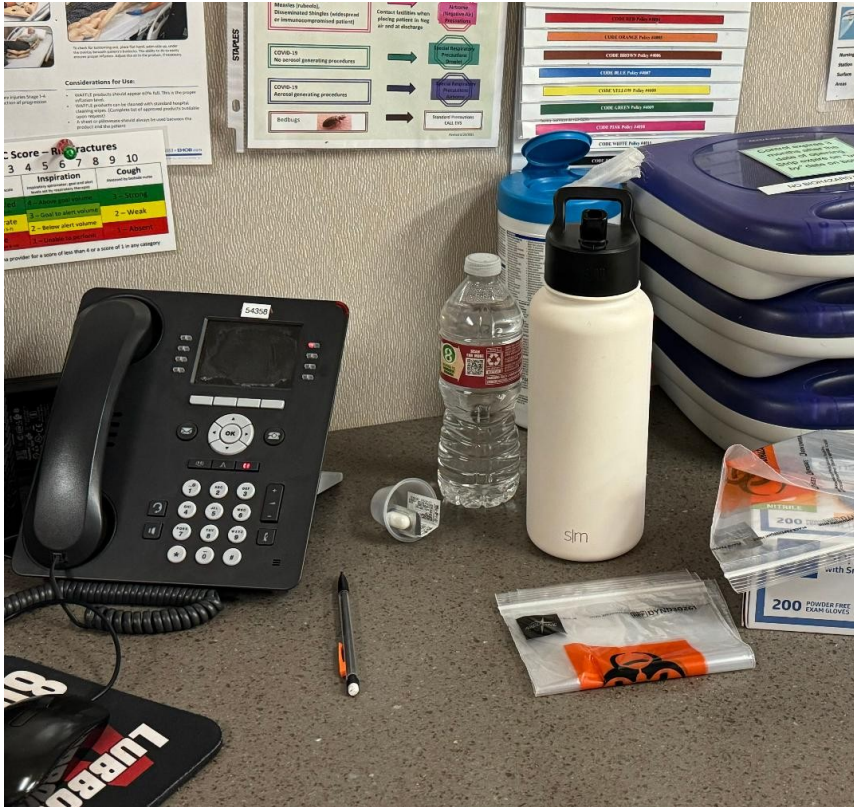
General Pharmacology Practice Questions:
