- Levaquin 500mg
- Piperacillin/tazobactam 3.375g
- Morphine 2mg
- Albuterol HHN
- 50% Dextrose Solution
- Metformin

Complete the Pathophysiology worksheet on the following disease processes.

- Coronary Artery Disease
- Diverticulitis
- Perforated Diverticula
- COPD
- Lung Cancer with Pneumonia
- Anaphylaxis
- Diabetes Type 2

Complete a medication worksheet for the following medications. You do not need to include a dose for the medications if one is not provided for you. Please give the primary reason a pt would take the medication.

- Aspirin 325mg PO Daily
- Hydrocodone/acetaminophen 7.5/325 mg
- Methylprednisolone 125 mg
- Furosemide 40 mg
- Rapid acting Insulin (Lispro)
- Long-acting Insulin (Glargine)

Bring written evidence that you have researched the following:

- Colostomy care and colostomy patient teaching
- Stoma care and teaching
- Pt teaching related to Up with Assistance Activity Level
- Advance diet as tolerated
- Proper insulin administration includes glucose monitoring and recognizing low/high blood sugar symptoms
- 3 discharge teaching/considerations for each disease process
