Report blood in stool or black tarry stools 2. Report any unusual bruising 3. Call before sitting up 4. Report any coffee ground emesis
Atorvastatin	40mg, PO, daily		To lower cholesterol levels, therefore lowering the risk for ischemic stroke.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Don't drink grapefruit juice while taking this medication. 2. Report muscle pain 3. Take at same time every day 4. Limit alcohol
Ceftriaxone	1g/10mL, IVP, daily	1g diluted in 10mL of sterile water. Pushed over 3-5 minutes.	To treat infection in the abdomen	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete full course of treatment 2. Drink lots of fluids 3. Avoid alcohol while taking 4. Use caution because of liver problems
Heparin	5,000 units, SQ, Q12		To thin the patients' blood since they are bedbound.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Report any bloody or tarry stool 2. Report any coffee ground emesis 3. Call don't fall 4. Report any unusual bruising
