Safety & Quality:

Clinical Judgment: Doctor wanted the baby to be moved to the NICU due to concerns from a previous nurse. The parents did not want the baby to be moved, so my nurse advocated for them by presenting her charting and findings for her past two shifts. She explained the baby was feeding adequately, had no weight loss, and the parents were complying with phototherapy orders and stated there was no need for a higher level of care; the doctor agreed and the baby got to stay roomed-in.
