1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

During this clinical rotation I was at a FNP/midwife clinic that focused on mostly gynecology visits, at least for the day I attended. I observed various pap-smears and a admin of a depo-vera injection.

2. What was the best/most interesting part of the experience?

It was interesting to have a real life visualization of what occurs during a pap-smear. It was interesting to observe the female anatomy (uterus, cervix) and see the patient education given to clients, for them to have an understanding of its purpose.

3. Is a community nursing position something that you would consider working in? Why or why not?

A community nursing position is something I would consider, especially when dealing w/ women's health. I enjoyed the routine aspect of a clinic, and the ~~var~~ various moments you have for pt education to build pt-provider relationship.

4. Do you feel like this community site met the needs of the population they serve? Why or why not?

I believe this community site met the needs of the population. All of the pts are encouraged to voice their concerns w/ sufficient time. The provider then guides/educates them on expectations/diagnosis. Many of the patients made it clear their questions were addressed.

5. Did you witness patient teaching? What general things were taught to this population? Do you feel that patient teaching in this community site was adequate? Why or why not?

Yes, I did witness patient teaching, especially before procedures occur (purpose explained) & 1st obstetrical exam. A pt voiced concern on cervical cancer since sister was diagnosed w/ this. This same pt had an abnormal pap smear & was HPV (+). The FNP explained that this abn ↑ risk for cervical CA, and that a possible colposcopy may be needed. At a pt's 1st obstetrical exam they're explained common body changes, medications that are safe, and a balanced diet guide.
