(What is most important for you to remember as you prepare for the NCLEX and future patient care?)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ schizophrenia has positive, negative and cognitive symptoms. ◦ Positive vs Negative Symptoms, positive symptoms have an acute onset that is visible and usually responds to antipsychotic medications. ◦ Negative symptoms have a prolonged onset, poor prognosis and interfere with daily functioning. ◦ Cognitive impairments are very critical, you have a deficit in memory, attention and executive functioning, are highly disabled and strongly affect rehabilitation independence and safety. ◦ Command hallucinations put patient at greater risk for self harm or harm to others and require immediate attention. ◦ Auditory hallucinations are most common. ◦ affect and social functioning are flat/blunted, apathy, and withdrawal impair relationships and quality of life. require psychosocial intervention. <p>It is most important to prioritize safety especially with command hallucinations.</p>	

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
