Community Site: Dr. Blann's office

1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe? I participated in taking every single BP manually. I was able to use the Doppler to listen and observe the fetal HR. I also was able to teach about a NST. I watched a Pap smear and placement of an IUD.

2. What was the best/most interesting part of the experience?

Definitely watching the placement of an IUD was very interesting. After hearing all these stories of women that received them and how traumatizing it was for them. The patient said it all depends on the environment and the person implanting it. This was the pt's second IUD and she said it was nothing like the first one. The way Dr. Blann talked through the whole procedure was very calming she said. She said the most uncomfortable feeling was when the doctor put the speculum in and opened up her vagina.

Yes it did meet the needs of the population they serve. They offered great teaching about pregnancy to the expecting mothers. They were able to do majority of the testing in office, but they didn't do lab work which was weird to me.

5. Did you witness patient teaching? What general things were taught to this population? Do you feel that patient teaching in this community site was adequate? Why or why not?

I witnessed lots of patient teaching. General things that were taught were what to start expecting during each stage of pregnancy they were in. Things to look out for with the IUD. Excessive bleeding after delivery. Breast feeding birth control and the pros and cons of it. Early signs of preeclampsia. Patient teaching in this office was more than adequate. The staff dumbed it down so much for the patients and they even included the father in the teaching and ways they can help out. They did teach back with the patient. The staff would not leave the room until the pt fully understood what was taught to them.

Safety & Quality:

Clinical Judgment: A pt stated “I haven’t felt baby move as much as he’s been moving these past couple of days but he moves a little bit.” When she was asked if she’s been feeling baby move. Instead of brushing it off the nurse decided to hook her up the the TOCOs and perform a NST. The results came back as a reactive NST. A pt’s BP was reading 164/94 and c/o mild swelling in her feet and slight HA. The pt stated “this is normal and it was like this with my other kids. My BP reads high when I come in but goes down later in the visit.” Instead of the nurse and doctor just letting her go home because she said it was normal they told her to go to the OB ED to get evaluated to be better safe than sorry.
