1. What did you observe during the day? Were there any specific procedures that were able to participate in or observe?

I got to observe multiple pap smears and the removal and insertion of a Nexplanon. Most of the patients were there for their annual well woman's exam. There was one follow-up regarding birth control/period and an OB to hear fetal heart rate.
