- first time pregnancies; ↑ risk for Preeclampsia
family Hx
Preexisting conditions
↑ maternal age
- as fluid leaks into extravascular spaces edema occurs in brain causing HTA
- The lateral position supports Placental Perfusion. The lower dependent (the one the pt is not laying on) is the arm the bp
- magnesium sulfate is used during Tx of Preeclampsia but therapeutic range to ↓ risk of seizure causes CNS depression for fetus which can cause IOL deaths during contractions
- infant will be born with low Apgar score & NICU will be utilized to help w/ resp depression & hyporeflexia

- Relevant client findings make a significant difference in achieving optimum outcomes for the pt & help determine the nursing priority
- deciding if the clients findings are normal or abnormal for pt but not looking for a cause of symptoms
- determine what is expected & unexpected for the client & what is relevant to the situation
- decide which relevant data requires follow up or are immediate concern
- recognizing the cues that pertain to the situation and distinguishing priority & importance is a required ability to the nurse
