"Acetaminophen helps lower fever and relieve mild pain. It's safe for infants when it's given at the right dose." 2. "When you use acetaminophen at home make sure to use the syringe that comes with the medicine, and only give the dose your provider tells you" 3. "This medicine is safe, but too much can hurt the liver so don't give any other medicines that contain acetaminophen, and don't increase the dose even if your baby still feels warm" 4. "After your baby gets acetaminophen, we watch to make sure their fever or discomfort improves, they're feeding normally, and they don't have vomiting, rash, or unusual sleepiness."

"Please let us know right away if you notice a new rash, swelling of the lips, face or eyes, and trouble breathing."
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
