Safety & Quality:

BECAUSE OF THE SEVERITY OF THE DISEASES OR INFECTIONS COMING INTO THE STD CLINIC, IT WAS VERY IMPORTANT TO USE PROPER PPE (GLOVES) WHILE HANDLING THESE PATIENTS BLOOD, & WHILE DOING PHYSICAL EXAMS. BECAUSE OF THESE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS, IT HELPS PREVENT HARM TO US OR POTENTIALLY SPREADING IT TO OTHER PATIENTS.

Clinical Judgment:

Patient Centered Care:

I DEMONSTRATED PATIENT CENTERED CARE BY PERFORMING FUNDAL RUBS INITIALLY IN THE OR TO ENSURE THE UTERUS WAS PROPERLY CONTRACTING & FIRM. BY PERFORMING THESE FUNDAL RUBS EVERY 15 MINUTES, IT PREVENTS/AIDS IN PREVENTING HEMORRHAGING DUE TO BLOOD & FLUID LOSS FROM SURGERY.

Professionalism:

WHILE AT THE STD CLINIC, A MAN CAME IN WITH SYMPTOMS OF AN STI. AFTER DRAWING HIS BLOOD, WE LEARNED THAT HE HAD CONTRACTED SYPHILIS. HE WAS VERY EMBARRASSED & NERVOUS BECAUSE HE HAS NEVER HAD AN STD BEFORE, BUT WE KEPT REASSURING HIM THAT IT WAS NOTHING TO BE EMBARRASSED ABOUT & THAT IT WAS GOOD THAT HE WAS SEEKING TREATMENT.

Communication & Collaboration:

I WAS ABLE TO USE PROPER COMMUNICATION & COLLABORATION BY LISTENING TO MY NURSE WHEN INSERTING A CATHETER, PRIOR TO SURGERY. I ALSO COLLABORATED WITH THE SCRUB TECH BY ASSISTING IN THE INSTRUMENT COUNT IN THE OR. BY USING THESE SKILLS, IT RESULTED IN A SAFE SURGERY FOR THE PATIENT AND AIDED IN A PROPER RECOVERY BY NOT HAVING TO RETURN FOR AN UNNECESSARY SURGERY TO REMOVE A RAG OR INSTRUMENT FROM SURGERY.
