- Ensure safety by summoning security if pt becomes combative or violent

Depress/Grief/Post Partum - Personality d/o

- Emotional confusion + Cognitive impairment may increase vulnerability to Post Partum depression
- Anhedonia + Anhedonia can interfere with bonding and caregiving after birth
- Impaired attention and reasoning may affect a mother's ability to safely care for her infant
- Emotional flattening may make it difficult to express affection toward baby
- Untreated depressive symptoms in schizophrenia can worsen functioning during Post Partum period.

- Synergistic drug use - alcohol and Benzo can result in CNS depression
- Speedball use - mixing cocaine and heroin to balance stimulant

- Opioids are only class of commonly used drug w/ antidote - Naloxone
- Person experiences frightening visual distortions and intense emotions r/t past hallucinogens
- Walking on eggshells is constant anxiety trying to avoid triggers
- For dual diagnosis, communicating w/ a pt who has substance abuse and mental d/o, ensuring both conditions are treated
- Continued monitoring after giving Naloxon is important to assure another reaction does not present
