**Old Testament Survey BI207
September-November, 2003**

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I. Course Description

This course is intended to give the student a good understanding of the content, history, and customs of the Old Testament. Helpful background information is given which will enhance the student's ability to interpret the Bible.

II. Course Objectives

As a result of taking this class, the student should be able to:

- A. Have an understanding of the different time periods covered in the Old Testament
- B. Have an understanding of how some Scripture contextually applies to Israel, and not the church today.
- C. Have an understanding of the spiritual condition of God's people as judges, kings and prophets delivered God's Word to them

III. Course Requirements

The student is to listen to all recorded lectures, and complete the material pertaining to the lectures. Memory verses are given throughout the lectures that the student must memorize and write from memory on the tests.

IV. Tests & Grading

Tests are graded on a percentage basis, with an 80% minimum passing grade. Scores less than 80% require that the student repeat the material.
