Intro to Greek PA402

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I. Course Description

The student learns the fundamentals of Greek grammar and is adequately prepared to study the original Greek text, as well as how to use Bible software e-sword to accomplish these tasks.

II. Course Objectives

- A. The goal of this course is that the student may obtain a thorough knowledge of basic Greek grammar, along with the grammar codes in e-sword, and that they may be able to use that knowledge with the Greek text in e-sword.

III. Course Requirements

- A. Download and install e-sword with required modules before the class.
- B. Learn the Greek alphabet with pronunciation. It is included with the Course Resources online.
- C. Practice reading the first chapter of John, also included with the course materials. This will help the student to learn the alphabet and pronunciation and will be important in class.

IV. Course Materials

A. Textbook: *The Translator's Greek Grammar of the Textus Receptus* by Dr. Steve Combs, published and sold by Old Paths Publications

B. e-sword: Free software with a minimum of the following modules. The software is free and can be found on www.e-sword.net. The student must download this software with the required modules and become familiar with it:

1. Greek NT+
2. KJV – This is the King James Version with text only
3. KJV+ - KJV with Strong's Numbers
4. RMAC – Robinson Morphological Analysis Codes
5. KJC – King James Concordance
6. Strong – Strong's Hebrew & Greek Dictionaries
7. Thayer – Thayer's Greek Definitions
8. These are the minimum requirements. The student may download as many resources as they desire. The required resources are free, but there are others available for purchase.

IV. Tests & Grading

The tests will be graded on a percentage basis with 80% the minimum score for a passing grade. Scores less than 80% will require the student to repeat the lessons pertaining to the test.
