When considering your top priority problem, you would not prioritize imbalanced nutrition over impaired skin or tissue integrity. It is a higher priority that the nurse address the patient's wounds and skin problems before focusing on nutrition status. Potential complications should be associated with your top priority problem. Although you listed three complications, since you chose imbalanced nutrition: less than body requirements as your top priority, it is not realistic to list sepsis or cardiac as potential complications. Potential complications may include dehydration, hypoglycemia, electrolyte imbalances, weakness, delayed wound healing, etc. |

Remember to prioritize assessments first, followed by medication administration and then other interventions such as education, ambulation, etc. |
