-Dietary history, weight history, factors that affect food intake, food allergies, psychosocial factors, full physical assessment. Signs of poor nutrition and anthropometric measurements.
2. What are the indications for TPN?  
-Long term therapy of 3 weeks or more, allowing bowel rest and healing, and to reduce activity of pancreas.
3. What are potential labs that may be ordered on the patient receiving TPN or PPN?  
-Glucose levels, CMP, electrolyte levels.
4. How frequently should the TPN tubing be changed?  
-The TPN tubing should be changed every 24 hours.
