The seven categories are 1. Symptom management, 2. Activities of daily living, 3. Encouragement, 4. Emotional support, 5. Nurturing Relationship, 6. Respect for religious Beliefs, and 7. Concern for cultural Differences

2. For each category provide an explanation of what was confirmed, reported, perceived, expected, or believed by nurse's or patient participants.

1. Symptom management- Patients are grateful that when their full physical problems get care for such as pain and nausea their overall health improves. 2. ADL- Nurses are expected to provide all aspects of a patients care such as bathing and it consumes their entire day. 3. Encouragement- nurses perceived encouragement as inspiring their patients to get better and ensuring self-care confidence. 4. Emotional support- nurses reported the need for patients to express their emotional needs. 5. Nurturing relationship- nurses confirm they contribute to communication between families and healthcare members. 6. Respect for religious beliefs- Patients beliefs are vital to provide accessibility in the health care setting. 7. Concern for cultural difference- cultural considerations are important for nurses to provide when creating care plans.
