- Hypotension 100/68
- Mild Weakness x4
- Multiple Scabs
- Multiple Bruises
- Pain 8/10
- Decreased Urine Output <500
- Peripheral Edema +1 Non-pitting
- Ascites
- No visible drainage from Pleurx

Lab findings/diagnostic tests*:

- 122 Sodium
- 24 BUN
- 2.20 Creatinine
- Blood Sugar 152
- CT showed viscous fluid in the lungs
- Bilateral Atelectasis

Risk factors*:

- Multiple falls in past 6 months
- Malnourished
- Cirrhosis
- Acute Kidney Injury

Nursing priorities*: ***Highlight the top nursing priority problem***

- Impaired Physical Mobility
- Fluid and Electrolyte Imbalance
- Excess Fluid Volume
- Ineffective Health Self management

Potential complications for the top priority:

- Pneumonia
 - Advantageous Lung Sounds
 - Low Pulse Oxygen
 - Elevated WBC
- Constipation
 - Hemorrhoids
 - Bowel Incontinence
 - Elevated BP
- Pressure Ulcer
 - Sepsis
 - Increased Length of Stay
 - Increased Pain
