1. Do the authors have qualifications listed? What are their qualifications? What is the domain? (.gov, .edu, .org)

2. When was the site created? When was the site last updated or revised?
The website does not have a date when it was created but the article was last reviewed on December 7, 2022.
3. Who is the targeted audience? Does the web site present facts or opinions?
The targeted audience is for individuals who are experiencing symptoms of food poisoning. The website displays factual information by listing the various types of symptoms and treatments that are associated with the illness.
4. How complete and accurate is the content information? Does it agree with other expert sources?
The content appears to be complete and accurate with providing an individual a comprehensive list of symptoms that are linked to food poisoning. Other credible sites provide the same information regarding food poisoning symptoms as this website does.
5. Does the site load quickly? Is it a secured site? Are there graphics, or pictures on the page that serve a purpose? If so what are they and how do they relate to the health issue?
The site loads quickly and appears to be secured since it is a government website. The website does include graphics, which helps individuals understand where anatomically food poisoning can affect them, and the types of symptoms they can experience that warrant the need to see a doctor.
