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Online Vital Signs Assignment: Week 2

Temporal Artery: Easy site when assessing pulse in children.

Carotid Artery: Patients with physiological shock.

Brachial Artery: Used to assess blood pressure in the upper extremities during CPR on infants.

Apical Artery: Heart-related health problems or taking cardiovascular medication.

Radial Artery: Assessing status of circulation to hand.

Ulnar Artery: Assess circulation to the ulnar side of the hand.

Femoral Artery: Assess during CPR when other pulses are not palpable.

Popliteal Artery: Used to find circulation to the lower leg.

Posterior Tibial: Assess circulation to foot.

Dorsalis Pedis: Assess circulation to foot.
