<b>Drug</b>	<b>Symptoms of Use</b>	<b>Symptoms of Intoxication</b>	<b>Symptoms of Withdrawal</b>
<p><b>CNS Depressants</b></p> <p>Examples: sedatives, tranquilizers, club drugs</p>	<p>Decreased dreams, respiratory depression, hypotension, decreased urine, decreased body temperature, decreased libido</p>	<p>Slurred speech, incoordination, unsteady gait, nystagmus, impairment in attention or memory, coma</p>	<p>Tremors, elevated blood pressure, nausea/vomiting, hallucinations, illusions, tachycardia, anxiety, seizures</p>
<p><b>CNS Stimulants</b></p> <p>Examples: amphetamines, cocaine, caffeine, nicotine</p>	<p>Restlessness, insomnia, increased alertness, increased heart rate, palpitations, constipation, sexual dysfunction</p>	<p>Euphoria. Anxiety, anger, impaired judgment, psychosis, pupil dilation, perspiration/chills, weight loss,</p>	<p>Intense feelings of lassitude and depression, crashing, and suicidal ideation</p>
<p><b>Opioids</b></p> <p>Examples: oxycodone, heroin, methadone, codeine</p>	<p>Euphoria, mood changes, pupil constriction, constipation, decreased sexual function, decreased libido</p>	<p>Euphoria followed by apathy, dysphoria, agitation, impaired judgment, drowsiness, slurred speech</p>	<p>Dysphoric mood, nausea/vomiting, muscle aches, rhinorrhea, pupil dilation, sweating, diarrhea, yawning, fever,</p>
<p><b>Hallucinogens</b></p> <p>Examples: ketamine, ololiuqui, LSD</p>	<p>Nausea/vomiting, chills, pupil dilation, trembling, loss of appetite, distortion of vision, paranoia, derealization, fear of losing control</p>	<p>Hallucinations, tachycardia, hypertension, sweating, blurred vision, seizures</p>	<p>No evidence of physical dependence resulting in withdrawal</p>

Examples: marijuana, NPS	Tachycardia, orthostatic hypotension, bronchodilation, alteration in hormone levels, disorientation, relaxation, increased sexual function	Impaired motor coordination, euphoria, anxiety, slowed time, social withdrawal, red eyes, increased appetite, dry mouth, tachycardia	Irritability, nervousness, sleep difficulty, decreased appetite, depressed mood, tremors, fever, chills, headache
<b>Inhalants</b> Examples: gas, varnish remover, lighter fluid, spray paint	Ataxia, speech problem, tremors, coughing/wheezing, nausea/vomiting, rash,	Dizziness, euphoria, excitation, nystagmus, blurred vision, slurred speech, lethargy, muscle weakness, coma	Restlessness, nausea/vomiting, runny nose, watery eyes, poor concentration, mood changes
