<b>CNS Depressants</b> Examples: Alcohol	Relaxation, loss of inhibitions, lack of concentration, slurred speech	Impaired judgement, impaired attention, slurred speech, N/V and tremors	Malaise, weakness, tachycardia, hypertension, depressed mood, hallucinations
<b>CNS Stimulants</b> Examples: Cocaine	Euphoria, hyperactivity, restlessness, talkative, tachycardia	Fighting, agitation, tachycardia, hypertension, sweating or chills, hallucinations	Depression, anxiety, irritability, fatigue, insomnia or hypersomnia, paranoid or suicidal ideations
<b>Opioids</b> Examples: Morphine	Euphoria, lethargy, drowsiness, lack of motivation and constricted pupils	Dysphoria, apathy, drowsiness, slurred speech, diarrhea, fever and insomnia	Cravings, nausea and vomiting, muscle aches, fever and insomnia, rhinorrhea, pupillary dilation
<b>Hallucinogens</b> Examples: LSD	Visual hallucinations, disorientation, confusion and paranoia, anxiety and	Blurred vision, rapid heart rate, weakness, dilated pupils, paranoia	No typical withdrawal symptoms but can feel anxious and unhappy

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	panic attacks	and visual hallucinations	
<b>Cannabinols</b> Examples: Cannabis	Relaxation, talkativeness, lowered inhibitions and mood swings	Euphoria, anxiety, impaired judgement, suspiciousness, sensation of slowed time	Restlessness, irritability, insomnia, loss of appetite, depressed mood, tremor and fever as well as chills and headache
<b>Inhalants</b> Examples: Ketamine	Drowsiness, confusion, and disorientation, Double vision, dizziness, and nausea, Increased heart rate and blood pressure, cravings	Impaired judgement, unsteady gait, nystagmus, lethargy, depressed reflexes, tremor and blurred vision	Restlessness, body aches, nausea and vomiting, poor attention and concentration, mood changes and seizures
