

Bollenbacher

Temporal: Easily accessible site used to assess pulse in children

Carotid: Easily accessible site used during physiological shock, cardiac arrest, or when other sites are not palpable

Apical: Site used to auscultate for apical pulse

Brachial: Site used to assess status of circulation to lower arm and to auscultate blood pressure

Radial: Common site used to assess character of pulse peripherally and status of circulation of hand

Ulnar: Site used to assess status of circulation to hand; also used to perform an Allen's test

Femoral: Site used to assess character of pulse during physiological shock or cardiac arrest when other pulses are not palpable; used to assess status of circulation to leg

Popliteal: Site used to assess status of circulation to lower leg

Posterior tibial: Site used to assess status of circulation to foot

Dorsalis pedis: Site used to assess status of circulation to foot
