1. What generations currently exist in the workforce? Briefly describe each generation.

The generations that currently exist in the work force include: The Silent Generation, the Baby Boomers, Generation X, Generation Y, and Generation Z. The silent generation are those born between ~1920-1940 and they make up fewer than 1% of the working class today. The baby boomers, born between ~1945 and 1960, makes up about 27% of the workforce and having members retiring every day. Generation X makes up about 35% of the work force with Generation Y making 37%. Generation Z, born after 2000 only makes up a small portion of those practicing the nursing profession.

1. What is TeamSTEPPS?

TeamSTEPPS is a system that is used in order to have the absolute best way that a care team can function together. This system directly reflects how the care team is working together and where areas of improvement are needed to benefit the patient.

2. What are the key skills of TeamSTEPPS? Briefly explain each.

The key skills of TeamSTEPPS are communication, team leadership, situation monitoring, and mutual support. Communication is simply just the way in which staff and coworkers are sharing information to one another. Team leadership means that we are making sure that everyone has a full understanding of what is going on and that we all have the resources and supplies available to do so. Situation monitoring is a act of continuously assessing the current situation and watching for any changes that may affect the care plan. Finally, mutual support is the sense that all staff is going to be there for each other and understand that everyone doing their part is equally as important and that we need to be there for each other.

3. What are the responsibilities of an effective team leader?

The responsibilities of an effective team leader include organizing the team, identify the teams goals, assign roles to the team members, be prepared to change the plan if needed, review the teams performances and be able to provide constructive feedback, encourage team support keep the environment safe both physically and mentally, ensure patient centered care, and be able to demonstrate the teamwork you would desire.
