 - a. The pediatrician didn't answer and the doctor discharged him when he was still just as sick as when he came into the hospital.
4. How will you use what you learned from Rory's case as a nurse, and how will this information guide your future practice?
 - a. I will use the information to prevent the deaths of children that can potentially be prevented by noticing the signs of sepsis.
