| <p>CNS Depressants</p> <p>Examples: Barbiturates (Amobarbital), nonbarbiturate hypnotics (Triazolam), antianxiety agents (Lorazepam), and club drugs (Flunitrazepam)</p> | <p>Alter body temperature, respiratory depression, hypotension, reduced urine output, decreased libido, decreased liver function, irregular sleep patterns and reduced urine output.</p> | <p>Sexual/aggressive behavior, mood liability, impaired judgement, and impaired social function.</p> | <p>Sweating, tachycardia, hand tremors, insomnia, nausea/vomiting, hallucinations, agitation, anxiety, seizures, and delirium.</p> |
| <p>CNS Stimulants</p> <p>Examples: Amphetamines (Dextroamphetamine), Synthetic stimulants (Methylone), Nonamphetamines (Modafinil), Caffeine, and Nicotine</p> | <p>Increased libido, anorexia, tachycardia, tremors, restlessness, insomnia, agitation, increased alertness, compulsive behavior, paranoia, constipation, cardiac arrhythmias, and hypertension.</p> | <p>Memory loss, psychosis, aggression, tachycardia, Respiratory depression, muscle weakness, chest pain, confusion, and dystonia.</p> | <p>Fatigue, headache, cramps, depression, flu-like symptoms, muscle pain, drowsiness, bradycardia, difficulty concentrating, and nightmares.</p> |
| <p>Opioids</p> <p>Examples: Opioids of natural origin (Codeine), Opioid derivatives (Heroin), and Synthetic opiate-like drugs</p> | <p>Sedations, constipation, bradycardia, mood changes, mental cloudiness, and nausea and vomiting.</p> | <p>Dysphoria, agitation, impaired judgement, slurred speech, drowsiness, coma or death.</p> | <p>Dysphoric mood, muscle aches, rhinorrhea, sweating, fever, vomiting, insomnia, and pupillary dilation.</p> |
| <p>Hallucinogens</p> <p>Examples: Naturally occurring hallucinogens</p> | <p>Chills, tachycardia, hypertension, fever, dizziness, loss of appetite, insomnia, sweating,</p> | <p>Anxiety, depression, paranoid ideations, fear of losing one’s mind, tachycardia, ataxia,</p> | <p>Agitation, hyperactivity, violence, hallucination, psychosis, and convulsions.</p> |

| Cannabinols Examples: Cannabis (Marijuana), and Synthetic cannabinoids (New Psychoactive Substance-Kush) | Tachycardia, orthostatic hypotension, increased libido, euphoria, disorientation, bronchitis, and persistent cough. | Impaired motor coordination, euphoria, anxiety, sensation of slowed time, impaired memory, dry mouth, tachycardia and social withdrawal. | Irritability, anger, aggression, nervousness, restlessness, anxiety, sleep difficulty, decreased appetite, depressed mood, abdominal pain, tremors, sweating, fever, and headache. |
| Inhalants Examples: Acetone, Butane, Propane and Ethyl chloride. | Apathy, decreased appetite, slurred speech, nose bleeds/runny nose, fatigue, and ulcers in nose or mouth. | Apathy, impaired judgment, dizziness, slurred speech, unsteady gait, lethargy, depressed reflexes, tremors, and blurred vision. | Restlessness, bod aches, nausea, vomiting, runny nose, poor attention and concentration, mood changes, tremors, panic attacks and seizures. |
