Boys and Girls Club Clinical Activity Rubric and Outline

Objective:

- Provide developmentally appropriate education to a specific pediatric population. (1,2,5)*
*Course Objectives

Directions: During your clinical rotation, you will be expected to complete a 3-hour clinical experience at the Boys and Girls Club of Erie County Youth Center. Students will be with a faculty member while at this clinical site. Each clinical group must prepare an activity appropriate for children ages 6 – 12 years old based on their assigned topic. Keep in mind that groups of children will rotate through your activity by age group, and that you may have to adjust your approach accordingly. For example, your communication style and activity details will be different with 5-6-year-olds compared with 10-12-year-olds. Topics for the activity are listed in the table below. Please see the clinical schedule to determine what group you are in.

When the kids separate, your group will separate as well. If you have a group of six, you will split into three groups of two. Groups of five will separate into two groups of two and one of one. Each group of two or one will be responsible for their portion of content to present. So, for example, two will start with kindergarteners, two with first grade, two with second grade. When your portion of content is covered (10-15 minutes) I will have you switch to another grade and you will do the same thing. We will rotate this way until all groups are finished. Then, we will go back to the cafeteria and do the same thing with the older grades. Be advised that you will need to adjust your communication styles as you move between groups of different ages based on their level of development. You will all interact with each age category. Keep in mind that things change slightly from year to year, but in general this is how it will go.

The activity will need to be approved by Brian prior to your scheduled day. Therefore, you will be expected to submit an outline detailing your activity to the Boys and Girls Club Dropbox by **September 8, 2025** at 0800. Refer to the Clinical Schedule and complete the survey evaluation by Friday @ 0800. You are required to wear your FRMC warm-up jacket, solid white shirt, and khakis. Please supply your own props.

The activity requirements and grading rubric are below. To be satisfactory for this experience you will need to score at least 90/100. For any student not completing the clinical day and activity, credit will not be granted for the clinical time and will follow the Student Accountability Flow Sheet. Remember any missed clinical time needs to be made up hour for hour.
