1. What is TeamSTEPPS?

TeamSTEPPS is an evidence based work system in 2007 that focused on improving communication and team work skills in the health care industry to improve patient outcomes. (Team Strategies and Tools to Enhance Performance and Patient Safety).

2. What are the key skills of TeamSTEPPS? Briefly explain each.

**Leadership-** Organizes the team, sets goals, assigns roles, and keeps the team focused on priorities and the plan of care. **Communication:** Shares information clearly, accurately, and promptly using tools like SBAR, callouts, and hand-offs. **Situation Monitoring:** Continuously observes the patient, environment, and team to identify changes or safety risks early. **Mutual Support:** Team members assist each other, give feedback, and speak up about safety concerns in a supportive environment.

3. What are the responsibilities of an effective team leader?

Establish clear goals and expectations, encourage team members to speak up, resolve conflicts quickly and professionally. Adjust the plan of care as patient conditions change. It is important to promote accountability and collaboration. It is also important to assign roles and responsibilities appropriately.
