1. What generations currently exist in the workforce? Briefly describe each generation.

1. What is TeamSTEPPS?

TeamSTEPPS is team strategies and tools to enhance performance and patient safety. It is based off evidence based framework to help connect skills to provide patient with adequate care.

2. What are the key skills of TeamSTEPPS? Briefly explain each.

The key skills are communication which is verbal and non verbal process in which information is accurately exchanged among team members. Another skill is team leadership which is to maximize the effectiveness of team members by making sure they have access to the correct resources, actions are understood, and changes in information are shared. Also includes situation monitoring which scanning and assessing situations to gain information and understanding to maintain awareness to support functioning of the team. Mutual support is the final skill, which helps the ability to support team members needs through accurate knowledge about their responsibilities and workload.

3. What are the responsibilities of an effective team leader?

The responsibilities are to organize the team, identify and articulate clear goals, assign task and responsibilities, monitor and modify the plan and communicate changes, provide feedback when needed, review team performance, manage and allocate resources, facilitate information sharing, encourage team to assist one another, foster a learning and psychologically safe environment, keep conflict healthy, model effective teamwork, and reinforce patient centeredness of all team members and actions.
