Week 2 (Hand Hygiene; Vital Signs; PPE): During lab this week you were able to satisfactorily demonstrate:

- Proper application and removal of personal protective equipment.
- Appropriate hand hygiene utilizing hand sanitizer and soap/water with two attempts.
- Beginner skills level during guided practice with measurement of temperature (oral, axillary, & rectal), radial & brachial pulses, respirations, and oxygen saturation. Vital signs skills will be observed 1:1 with faculty during Week 3. AR

Week 3 (Vital Signs):

You were satisfactory during your 1:1 observation of vital signs, requiring one prompt as a reminder, verbalizing that you would take a pulse as part of your orthostatic blood pressure assessment. You were accurate on 2 out of 3 BP measurements on the Vital Sim manikin, 128/74 was your

first reading, and V-Sim read 128/74. Excellent! The second reading was 110/62, and V-sim read 110/68! Great job! You verbally identified the procedure for axillary and rectal temperatures, along with orthostatic BP/pulse. The apical pulse will be assessed during the 1:1 observation of the Head to Toe Assessment. You completed the assigned VS documentation in the Meditech 6.1 Test Hospital. You did a great job practicing on V-Sim prior to evaluation, this benefited you greatly. I could see at first you were nervous but despite this, you were very professional and patient focused. Keep up the good work in the lab! LW
