STEMI Scenario

Please write an SBAR for the patient you cared for during the STEMI Scenario. This SBAR is the report you will provide to the oncoming RN at the end of your shift, after the patient arrives on 4C from the Cath Lab.

S	61 yr old male came into ER with a STEMI. He was taken to cath lab and had a PTCA for a 100% occlusion to the mid and proximal RCA. 2Alpine stents were placed and a ExoSeal was placed. Was given a heparin bolus and drip prior to cath lab and once in cath lab was given Angiomax bolus and drip. Was given morphine sulfate in ER but has denied pain for me, slight discomfort in his back. He currently has telemetry on, it appears he has a-fib and has been started on a amiodarone drip at 0.333ml/hr. for the past hour, after 6 hrs. drip should be increased to 30ml/hr. for 18 hrs., per the protocol and orders.
B	He has a history of HTN, DM II, hyperlipidemia is a 1PPD smoker and is noncompliant with treatment. He has a family history of CAD. Reassessment of his blood work show a troponin of 4.1, in the ER was a 0.8. (Would provide last set of vitals). Pt lives with his wife.
A	Pt c/o of lower back pain but the chest pain has resolved. Heart rate is irregular. Lung sounds in bases have crackles, but the uppers are clear with auscultation. Right groin puncture site appears dry and intact. Pt is alert and oriented x3 and BL pupils are equal round and reactive. Bowels sounds are WNL in all four quadrants. He denies numbness and tingling in all extremities.
R	Pt has telemetry on and needs to be watched closely. I would see if he can't describe his back pain a bit better, he did not rate it or describe it for me, he also does not have anything ordered for pain should he need it.
