Educational needs concerning the children could be education directed toward the child itself or toward the parents whichever is appropriate. Please identify the family member for each of the identified educational needs. Utilize the Education Plan form to fill out your Education Plan for the family. Please address all areas of the Education Plan. Your Education Plan will be evaluated in the Response section of the Simulation Rubric.

Learning Needs Identified:

1. Identify 3 learning needs for each family member. Educational needs concerning the children could be education directed toward the child itself or toward the parents whichever is appropriate. Remember to be specific.

Education Opportunities Prioritized	Barriers to Education Plan
1 Abuse and Safety	Pt. may not feel stable enough to leave her situation, therefore fear of what her options will be if she does leave may keep her from seeking help. Also fear of retaliation from infants father may keep her from seeking help. Patient also seems to be having symptoms of PPD which can alter her perception of how severe the risk is to her and the children, or after talking with the boyfriend, possibly her own participation in posing a risk to others for abuse and neglect.
2 PPD and mental health	Pt. may not realize or want to acknowledge the symptoms she is having, is a reoccurrence of PPD, after her now second pregnancy. Due to her mental health status, pt. may not realize how severe her own reactions to stressors have been. May not be open to seeking professional help, or may be unable to due to the abusive situation she is currently living in.
3 HTN/ smoking and diet	Pt. has limited access to transportation so the

	option to shop every day for wholesome fresh foods is not available. Shelf stable items with high sodium content is what has been available, and infant father has been providing what food does come into home. Quitting smoking after a long period of time is extremely difficult, and combined with current stressors in patient's life, to quit smoking may not be a priority for her, even with the HTN risks.

Family Member	Learning Need	Learning Outcome
	1 Risks of smoking with HTN	Patient will understand severe health risks associated with smoking and being diagnosed with HTN.
	2 Abuse resources	Patient will be given information on domestic violence shelters in the area, and emergency hotline numbers to call, Will understand there are options for her to leave and be safe.
	3 PPD and mental health	Patient will understand importance to seek help regarding her PPD symptoms, and to take medications as prescribed if provided to ensure no harm will come to herself or others.
