(List at least two ideas.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Look to see if children create collections with toys especially during Work Time - Listen to the questions children ask - what are they trying to learn from these questions?
Do I have materials in the classroom to support this type of play?	R. Writing	<p>How will you plan to look for the missing item? (List at least two ideas.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Have notepads and pencils in the House Area - Have whiteboards and markers in the Writing Area - Create name tracing packets
Are there activities that I could do throughout my daily routine to support this COR Advantage item?	O. Alphabet knowledge	<p>How will you plan to look for the missing item? (List at least two ideas.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - During Small Group, have an alphabet bingo match and see if they can match the letter sound to the written letter - During Large Group, do an alphabet scavenger hunt; have the children look for items starting with each letter
Could I use language related to the missing COR Advantage item to support children's learning and development in this area?	T. Geometry: shapes and spatial awareness	<p>How will you plan to look for the missing item? (List at least two ideas.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - When playing with blocks, ask the children "What shape is that? Is it short, long, round, etc." - Show how objects can be shapes. For example, clocks are circles, I would say, "That's a clock, it looks like a circle. It is round."
