

In my preschool classroom, I try to choose activities that allow for shared control and are also highly interactive. For example, we play with scarves, where I might do a few movements and have kids imitate and I go around the group and each child comes up with a movement with the scarf and the rest of the group follows. We also make up silly rhymes, where students take turns making silly words. I do my level best to keep kids engaged where they are free to share and encouraged to express and come up with their ideas.
