Learning Tasks for Week 6

In your response, do not write out the scripture/verse. Paraphrase the verse and use a parenthetical reference. Example: Through Paul's teaching to the believers in Ephesus, he shares that the work of ministry in a local community of faith should never be limited to the pastor (Eph. 4:11-12).

Learning Task 1: In this week's reading, the author talks about replacement (e.g., "replace lying with the truth" [Eph. 4:25]). In 5 sentences, share whether you have something in your life that needs replacing, and share your progress with making that replacement.
