

Continuity of Care: Role of the Case Manager

- Help people going through a major transition
- Home assessments to improve in-home safety
- Find help for transportation to appointments or affording medications

Infections: Regulations for STI Reporting

- The CDC develops a list of nationally reportable STI's
- PCP's must report to the state or local health department
- It is up to the health department whether or not to report these up to the CDC

Communicable Diseases: Providing Education for a Client Who Has Pertussis

- The incubation period for this disease is up to 20 days.
- This disease can be spread through direct AND indirect contact, so patients should wash hands and items touched frequently
- The chances of spreading this disease are highest at the beginning, when symptoms mirror a common cold

Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: Planning Health Promotion Strategies for Older Adults at an Assisted Living Facility

- Give appropriate vaccines (influenza and herpes zoster)
- Ensure medications are taken on time
- Keep areas clear of clutter and trip hazards

HIV/AIDS: Teaching About Diagnostic Testing

- Positive ELISA test
- Western Blot test or indirect immunofluorescence assay
- AND tested for viral load

Overview of Community Health Nursing: Priority Finding During School Health Screenings

- Signs of physical violence (bruising, unexplained injuries, etc)
- Lack of current vaccinations
- Signs of depression/ suicide risks for adolescents

Continuity of Care: Priority Assessment for a Client Following a Traumatic Amputation

- Connect clients with appropriate resources to promote maximum self-care ability
- Nurses must advocate for client rights following a disability
- Clients who have a traumatic amputation are considered emergent and must receive immediate medical care

Complementary and Alternative Therapies: Incorporating Client Preferences Into Care

- The nurse should consider client preference when selecting the age and gender of an interpreter
- The nurse should incorporate variations of verbal and nonverbal communication according to client preferences
- The nurse should address client literacy needs according to client preference

Barriers to Adequate Nutrition: Nonpharmacologic Interventions to Manage Nausea

- Offer several small meals throughout the day
- Provide oral care prior to and following meals
- Provide liquid supplements between meals to increase nutrient intake
