Clinical Hours: 9am -2:00 pm The clinic is at the east end of the large shopping mall area. It only takes about 8 minutes to get to the clinic from the college. You go east on Fairchild to Bowman Avenue and then turn north (left). Bowman curves to the right just before you come to the shopping mall area. There is plenty of parking in front of the building.

As always, you will be in uniform and have your badge and masks. When you arrive, you will check in at the front desk and then will be directed to the appropriate office.

N442 – Active Learning for Women’s Care Clinic Shadowing Experience

Complete this Active Learning activity after your clinical at the Women’s Care Clinic. Submit your completed assignment to the dropbox within 1 week of this clinical rotation. **Be sure you look at the attached rubric as you write up this assignment because it must be written with accurate grammar and spelling as well as APA format for references.** Your score will be based on this rubric. You must receive 77% in order to pass this clinical assignment.

1. How many clients were seen today at the clinic?
The Women's Care Clinic saw three clients while this student nurse was there.
2. What were the activities that the Social worker and the nurse performed today?
The social worker made calls to clients to check in with them and make sure that they had all the resources they needed about pregnancy and insurance. The nurse performed an ultrasound on a client who was around 22 weeks gestation, and this was the client's first ultrasound.
3. How were you an engaged nursing professional today?
This student nurse engaged in the nursing profession today by being included in an ultrasound and conversing with clients.
4. How did you contribute to the service provided by the clinic nurse today?
This student nurse did not have the opportunity to contribute to the nurse's service because there was only one ultrasound today, which the nurse explained to this student nurse while performing.
5. What are the health risks of the population served during today’s clinical based on your observations today?
The health risks of the population served during this clinical are a lack of prenatal care and premature birth risk. The lack of prenatal care is made evident by the client that had her first ultrasound at 22 weeks gestation. This client stated that she had called a provider and is waiting for a call back. Many clients also had issues with insurance, which is why there is a lack of prenatal care. There is also a client who attends the Women’s Care Clinic that is 15 years of age and is at risk for her baby's premature birth.
6. How does this clinical site relate to the Population and Global Health Course?
This clinical site relates to the Population and Global Health Course because this clinical site is a significant part of the community that resides in Vermillion county. This clinic gives services to women that fall in the lower-income bracket. This clinical site provides classes related to parenting and child safety. The clinic also has a program where the mothers get to go to a “market” and purchase items for their child with points that they receive from attending meetings, prenatal appointments, and improving their lives in general.
7. Name 3 ways this clinical site impacts Population and Global health?
This clinical site impacts Population and Global health by providing resources to women who may not have them otherwise. Providing free ultrasounds and pregnancy tests to women and providing classes for infants' fathers, an up and coming program the Women’s Care Clinic is trying to get in motion.
8. Choose one of the health risks identified in question 6 and develop a plan of care to address this. Include a Nursing diagnosis, a measurable goal, and at least 3 Nursing interventions to achieve this goal.

This student nurse's health risk identified the most in the clinical setting is the lack of prenatal care. The nursing diagnosis this student nurse believes should be in place is insufficient knowledge related to poverty and lack of prenatal care as evidenced by low-income households with single mothers and multiple children. The client's goal is to attend at least three prenatal visits within the time of the client's pregnancy. Three nursing interventions to achieve this goal are providing information about classes that the Women's Care Clinic offers, helping the client schedule an ultrasound appointment, and providing the client with a list of local OB/GYN providers and their contact information.

9. How will your experience during the Women's Care Clinic job shadowing impact your Nursing practice?

The Women's Care Clinic experience will help this student nurse have more compassion for the lower-income mothers and the struggles that the client's experience. This student nurse now knows of more available resources to mothers that are expecting and that she can provide information about those resources to future clients.
