

Management of Care

- Continuity of Care
 - Information Technology: Commonly Used Abbreviations
 - SOAP (Subjective data, objective data, assessment, plan)
 - PIE (Problem, intervention, evaluation)
 - DAR (Data, action response)
- Legal Rights and Responsibility
 - Legal Responsibilities: Identifying Negligence
 - A nurse failing to implement precautions for a patient who needs said precautions (ex. Fall risk)
 - A nurse knows not initiating the necessary precautions may cause harm.
 - A nurse discovers a patient has fallen and fractured their hip.

Safety and Infection Control

- Accident/Error/Injury Prevention
 - Head and Neck: Performing the Weber's Test
 - Place the tuning fork on top of the patient's head.
 - Ask the patient how long they hear the sound.
 - Ask the patient which ears they hear the sound.
 - Nursing Process: Priority Action Following a Missed Provider Prescription
 - Document the error.
 - Notify the provider.
 - Initiate the succeeding steps following a received prescription.
- Reporting of Incident/Event/Irregular Occurrence/Variance
 - Information Technology: Situation Requiring an Incident Report
 - Medication errors
 - Falls
 - Needlesticks
- Safe Use of Equipment
 - Home Safety: Teaching About Home Care of Oxygen Equipment
 - Keep oxygen away from gas and electricity sources.
 - Keep a "No Smoking Oxygen in Use" sign on the door.
 - Use cotton linens.
- Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis
 - Infection Control: Caring for a Client Who Is Immunocompromised
 - Have visitors wear surgical masks while visiting.
 - Do not consume fresh fruits and vegetables
 - Visitors cannot bring flowers.
 - Infection Control: Isolation Precautions While Caring for a Client Who Has Influenza
 - Initiate droplet precautions.

- Patient should wear a mask outside of their room.
- Masks are required for the interprofessional team while present with the patient.
- Infection Control: Protocols for Multidrug-Resistant Infections
 - Initiate contact precautions.
 - Gloves and gowns must be worn by care givers.
 - A private room must be instituted or a room with other patients with the same infection.

Basic Care and Comfort

- Mobility/Immobility
 - Ergonomic Principles: Safely Transferring a Client from the Bed to a Chair
 - Evaluate the patient's ability to bear weight.
 - Maintain good posture.
 - Do not assist by bending at the waist.
- Nutrition and Oral Hydration
 - Fluid Imbalances: Calculating a Client's Net Fluid Intake
 - One cup (8 oz) is equal to 240 mL.
 - A full cup of ice equals 120 mL.
 - Include IV infusions.
 - Nutrition and Oral Hydration: Advancing to a Full Liquid Diet
 - Liquid dairy
 - All juices
 - Pureed vegetables (some facilities)
- Rest and Sleep
 - Rest and Sleep: Interventions to Promote Sleep
 - Maintain consistent wake times.
 - Avoid caffeine and exercise close to bedtime.
 - Do not attempt to fall asleep with the TV on.

Pharmacological and Parenteral Therapy

- Medication Administration
 - Safe Medication Administration and Error Reduction: Confirming a Client's Identity
 - Verify verbalized name and birthday with the MAR and patient's wristband.
 - Telephone numbers and ID cards can be used.
 - Two identifiers must be used.
- Parenteral/Intravenous Therapies
 - Intravenous Therapy: Selection of an Intravenous Site
 - Use gravity and fist clenching
 - Use a site that is not painful
 - Select a soft, resilient vein that will bounce with palpation.

Reduction of Risk Potential

- Lab Values
 - Airway Management: Collecting a Sputum Specimen
 - Collect sputum specimen in the morning.
 - Perform chest physiotherapy to mobilize secretions.
 - Suctioning may be required to collect specimen.

Physiological Adaptation

- Alterations in Body Systems
 - Airway Management: Performing Chest Physiotherapy
 - Chest percussion and postural drainage mobilize secretions.
 - Specific lobes can undergo therapy.
 - Postural drainage includes positions such the Trendelenburg and side-lying.
