

N433 Concept Map: Items to Include

- I. Demographic Data**
 - a. Date of admission
 - b. Admission Diagnosis/Chief Complaint
 - c. Age
 - d. Gender
 - e. Allergies
 - f. Weight in kg
 - g. Psychosocial Developmental Stage
 - h. Cognitive Developmental Stage
- II. Medical history**
 - a. Previous medical history
 - i. Prior hospitalizations
 - ii. Past surgical history
 - iii. Chronic medical issues
- III. Admission history**
 - a. Discuss why the client sought care
 - b. What brought them to the hospital
 - c. How were symptoms managed prior to being admitted (or put NA if it doesn't apply, i.e., trauma)
- IV. Pathophysiology of chief complaint or primary medical diagnosis**
 - a. Disease process is thoroughly discussed from the cellular level, examines how the disease process influences affected body systems
 - b. Signs/symptoms of disease
 - c. Diagnosis of disease
 - d. Treatment of disease
- V. Lab Data**
 - a. All abnormal labs discussed and related to diagnosis or chronic health condition
 - b. Includes normal lab values for all abnormal labs
 - c. Reviews diagnostic imaging completed and relates it to diagnosis
 - d. If no labs/imaging, put N/A
- VI. Current medications**
 - a. All medications are listed
 - b. Pharmacological classification of each medication included
 - c. Why the client is taking the medication
 - d. Key nursing assessment(s) prior to administration
- VII. Physical Exam**
 - a. Relate pertinent assessment findings to diagnosis
 - b. Includes assessment of any body system affected by diagnosis
 - c. Assesses VS (highlight abnormal)
 - d. Pain assessment
- VIII. Orders**

- a. All active orders for treatment
- b. Relate why it is relevant for diagnosis
- IX. Nursing Diagnoses**
 - a. 3 Nursing diagnoses prioritized appropriately
 - b. Identify rationale for why this nursing diagnosis was chosen
 - c. Provide 2 interventions per nursing diagnosis to address deficit
 - d. Evaluation of interventions
- X. Presentation**
 - a. Concept map is organized, legible, and used colors/fonts that are easy to read
- XI. Narration**
 - a. Concepts presented on concept map are explained and related using recorded narration or are presented in post-conference
