Management of Care -4

- o **RN CH—Chapter 9 Continuity of Care: Priority action during home visit**
 - Home visits provide community health nurses with the opportunity to observe the home environment and to identify barriers and supports to health-risk reduction.
 - Assess for any safety concern in the house
 - Assess for health care needs and access to outside resources.
- o **Fund—Chapter 15 Security and Disaster Plans: Performing Client Triage**
 - Emergent category or red tag: Highest priority is given to patients who have life threatening injuries and a high chance of survival if stabilized.
 - Urgent category or yellow tag: Major injuries not life threatening can but can deteriorate quickly
 - Nonurgent category or green tag: Clients who have minor injuries and do not need immediate attention.
 - Expectant Category or black tag: Lowest priority not expected to live and allowed to die naturally. Comfort measures only and no restorative care.
- o **RN CH—Chapter 7 Care of Specific Populations: Migrant Population**
 - Less access to dental, mental health, and pharmacy services or inability to afford care

- Reduced availability of services due to distance, transportation, hours of service, lack of health record tracking.
 - Language barriers and cultural aspects of health care
 - **RN CH—Chapter 8 Practice Settings and Nursing Roles in the Community: Evaluating Client Understand of Hospice Care**
 - Clients can receive hospice care in a variety of settings, including the home, hospice centers, hospitals, and long-term care settings.
 - Hospice care is a comprehensive care delivery system for clients who are terminally ill. Further medical care aimed toward a cure is stopped.
 - The focus becomes relief of pain and suffering, as well as enhancing quality of life.
- ✚ **Basic Care and Comfort -1**
 - **Nut—Chapter 11 Barriers to Adequate Nutrition: Nonpharmacological Interventions to Manage Nausea**
 - Eat cold or room-temperature foods.
 - Try high-carbohydrate, low-fat foods and avoid fried foods.
 - Do not eat prior to chemotherapy or radiation.
- ✚ **Health Promotion and Maintenance -2**
 - **RN CH—Chapter 8 Practice Settings and Nursing Roles in the Community: Parish Nursing**
 - Members of faith communities represent the entire lifespan and all family types. This offers nurses the opportunity to work with a diverse population within the same setting.
 - Faith community nurses provide interventions to individuals and groups in homes, congregational meeting places, acute or long-term care facilities, or through schools.
 - Nursing interventions are based on spiritual, physical, emotional, and social dimensions
 - **RN NCC—Chapter 3 Health Promotion of Infants (2 Days to 1 Year): Evaluating Parent Understanding of Infant Care**
 - Avoid warming formula in a microwave; check temperature of liquid before feeding
 - Crib mattresses should be kept in the lowest position possible with the rails all the way up.
 - The safest area for infants is the backseat of care.
- ✚ **Psychosocial Integrity -4**
 - **RN CH—Chapter 1 Overview of Community Health Nursing: Secondary Prevention Strategies Related to Abuse**
 - Identify and screen those at risk for abuse and individuals who are potential abusers.
 - Assess and evaluate any unexplained bruises or injuries of any individual.
 - Screen all pregnant women for potential abuse.
 - **RN CH—Chapter 7 Care of Specific Population: Priority Interventions for a Client Who has Experienced a Loss**

- Support the client in anticipatory grieving and inform the client of expected reactions to grief and loss
 - Provide the client with resources to adjust to loss such as individual counseling, support groups
 - Evaluate the client's coping and fears related to grief and loss.
- o RN CH—Chapter 2 Factors Influencing Community Health: Cultural Variations in Expression of Pain**
- Pain is perceived by the patient and can only be reported by the patient.
 - Some cultures, such as American Indian, Asian, Black, Hispanic, are very stoic regarding pain and may maintain a neutral facial expression despite being in severe pain.
 - Some religions may believe pain is a part of God's plan, a test of faith, or penance for past sins.
- o RN MH—Chapter 18 Substance Use and Addictive Disorders: Manifestation of Alcohol Withdrawal**
- Abdominal cramping, vomiting, tremors, restlessness, and inability to sleep.
 - Increased heart rate, blood pressure, respiratory rate, and temperature.
 - Severe disorientation, hallucination and delirium
