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Background: Betty is an 87-year-old female. She resides at home alone. She has two children that are active participants in her care. They are able to visit her once a day. Betty Jane is alert and oriented. Her major struggles in her home environment are mainly due to her extensive limitations in range of motion to her upper extremities related to rheumatoid arthritis and history of a fractured right humerus. She recently visited the walk in clinic where you work and was diagnosed with a urinary tract infection. You are the nurse in charge of calling in her antibiotic to the pharmacy. Betty does not drink alcohol, smoke, or do illicit drugs.

Insurance: She has both Medicare and Medicaid coverage.

Allergies: None

Diet: No added salt

Medical diagnosis: Rheumatoid arthritis, GERD, atrial fibrillation, and hypertension.

Current medications include the following:

Lisinopril 5 mg po daily

Hydroxychloroquine 300 mg by mouth twice a day

Jantoven 7.5 mg po daily

Percocet 5/325 mg Q12 hours PRN

Lasix 10 mg by mouth twice daily

Omeprazole 20mg po daily

AZO Cranberry tablet 500 mg po twice daily

Multivitamin with minerals one tablet po daily

Acetaminophen 650 mg po Q6H PRN

Bactrim 400/80 po every 12 hours X 10 days

The patient has a limited range of motion in the upper extremities and rheumatoid arthritis which may affect opening medication bottles and picking up medications when her children are not there. Medication compliance may be affected for medication that is prescribed to be taken more than one time per day. Since the patient is also elderly, it is important to make sure she takes her medication on time and within the prescribed amount. It would be best for the patient to utilize a reminder system to ensure she is taking the right medication.

Is there anything about this medication regimen scenario that might assist the client in maintaining the medication regimen as ordered?

The patient has an active support system that can help the patient maintain medication compliance.

What suggestions might you make to the prescriber and/or client (or questions you might ask the prescriber) to help this client scenario? (think about decreasing the potential for interaction(s) through medication reduction, other potential medications, diet changes, lifestyle changes, etc)

I would ask the prescriber if there was another possible medication besides warfarin that the patient could take for her atrial fibrillation. There are many drug-drug interactions between warfarin and her other medications. I would also ask the prescriber to monitor kidney function due to multiple medications being used that are metabolized in the kidneys.

What would the patient's monthly out-of-pocket expense for all 10 medications? (Total Cost for all 10 meds)?

The out-of-pocket total would be \$207.22.

Reflective Statement of Experience:

This project is eye-opening to the expense of medications. While researching the cost of each medication on GoodRX, the prices varied based on what store the patient would be picking up the medication from. In some cases, the patient may be on a fixed income or have very limited options in terms of where they can pick up their medication. These factors can affect medication compliance and overall patient health.
